**Privacy Concerns for Personal Information** Membership lists, luncheon/meeting attendance lists, all member information is confidential and may not be given to anyone - not to the NCGOP, not to your County Chair, to no one, under pain of expulsion for any member who divulges it. This is in the Bylaws.

### **Privacy at Meetings**

Have a policy regarding the press or other media at meetings and/or video recording or tape recording of speeches. Especially in the campaign season, you should ask if members of the press or media are present and require that they follow your policy. Make this part of your Standing Rules.

**May 10:** Deadline to submit an absentee ballot request form for the 2022 statewide primary.

**May 14:** One-stop, in-person early voting period ends at 3 p.m. for the 2022 statewide primary.

**May 17:** Election Day for the 2022 statewide primary and absentee ballot return deadline.
